The Money to be applied towards diſcharging the Debts of the Corporation on account of the Middle and South Levels.

Publick Act.

II. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforeſaid, That all and every Sums and Sum of Money whatsoever which ſhall ariſe by ſuch Sale or Sales as aforeſaid, ſhall (after firſt diſcharging the Coſts, Charges, and Expences attending the paſſing this preſent Act, and the Execution thereof) be applied by the ſaid Corporation, ſo far as the ſame will extend, towards the Payment and Diſcharge of the ſaid Bond Debts of the ſaid Corporation upon account of the ſaid Middle and South Levels, and to or for no other Purpoſe whatsoever: And in caſe the ſaid Debts of the ſaid Corporation ſhall at any Time, either by the Means aforeſaid, or by any other Means, be wholly diſcharged, then and from thenceforth the ſaid Power of Sale hereby given ſhall ceaſe and determine.

III. And be it further enacted and declared by the Authority aforeſaid, That this Act ſhall be deemed and allowed in all Courts within this Kingdom to be a Publick Act; and ſhall be judicially taken notice of as ſuch, by all Judges, Juſtices, and other Perſons, without ſpecially pleading the ſame.

C H A P. XXVI.

An Act to repeal ſo much of two Acts, made in the ſixteenth and ſeventeenth Years of the Reign of his preſent Maſteſty, as prohibits Trade and Intercourſe with the United States of *America*.

ſo far as they prohibit Trade and Intercourſe with *America*, repealed.

‘ WHEREAS it is highly expedient that the Intercourſe between *Great Britain* and the United States of *America* ſhould be immediately opened; be it therefore enacted and declared by the King’s moſt Excellent Maſteſty, by and with the Advice and Conſent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this preſent Parliament aſſembled, and by the Authority of the ſame, That an Act, paſſed in the ſixteenth Year of his Maſteſty’s Reign (intituled, *An Act to prohibit all Trade and Intercourſe with the Colonies of New Hampshire, Maſſachuſet’s Bay, Rhode Iſland, Connecticut, New York, New Jerſey, Penſylvania, the Three Lower Counties on Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia, during the Continuance of the preſent Rebellion within the ſaid Colonies reſpectively; for repealing an Act, made in the fourteenth Year of the Reign of his preſent Maſteſty, to diſcontinue the Landing and Diſcharging, Lading or Shipping of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, at the Town and within the Harbour of Poſton, in the Province of Maſſachuſet’s Bay; and alſo two Acts, made in the laſt ſeſſion of Parliament, for reſtraining the Trade and Commerce of the Colonies in the ſaid Acts reſpectively mentioned; and to enable any Perſon or Perſons, appointed and authorized by his Maſteſty to grant Pardons, to iſſue Proclamations, in the Caſes and for the Purpoſes therein mentioned*); and alſo an Act paſſed in the ſeventeenth Year of his Maſteſty’s Reign, (intituled, *An Act for enabling the Commiſſioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, to grant Commiſſions to the Commanders of private Ships and Veſſels employed in Trade, or retained in his Maſteſty’s Service, to take and make Prize of all ſuch Ships and Veſſels, and their Cargoes, as are therein mentioned, for a limited Time*); ſo far as the ſaid Acts, or either of them, may extend, or be conſtrued to extend, to prohibit Trade and Intercourſe with the Territories now compoſing the ſaid United States of *America*, or to authorize any Hoſtilities againſt the Perſons or Properties of the Subjects and Citizens of the ſaid United States, after the reſpective Periods ſet forth in his Maſteſty’s Proclamation, for the Ceſſation of Hoſtilities between *Great Britain* and the United States of *America*, bearing Date the fourteenth Day of *February*, one thouſand ſeven hundred and eighty-three, ſhall be, and the ſame are henceforth repealed.

C A P. XXVII.

An Act to aſcertain and eſta bliſh the Boundaries of and between the Hoſpital of *Bridewell* and the *Preſbiterian* thereunto belonging, and the *Parish of Saint Ann Blackfriars*, in the City of *London*, as therein ſpecified.

C A P. XXVIII.

An Act for preventing and removing all Doubts which have ariſen, or might ariſe, concerning the excluſive Rights of the Parliament and Courts of *Ireland*, in Matters of Legislation and Judicature; and for preventing any Writ of Error or Appeal from any of his Maſteſty’s Courts in that Kingdom from being received, heard, and adjudged, in any of his Maſteſty’s Courts in the Kingdom of *Great Britain*.

‘ WHEREAS, by an Act of the laſt ſeſſion of this preſent Parliament (intituled, *An Act to repeal an Act, made in the ſixth Year of the Reign of his late Maſteſty King George the Firſt, intituled, An Act for the better ſecuring the Dependency of the Kingdom of Ireland upon the Crown of Great Britain*), it was enacted, That the ſaid laſt-mentioned Act, and all Matters and Things therein contained, ſhould be repealed: And whereas Doubts have ariſen whether the Proviſions of the ſaid Act are ſufficient to ſecure to the People of *Ireland* the Rights claimed by them to be bound only by Laws enacted by his Maſteſty and the Parliament of that Kingdom, in all Caſes whatever, and to have all Actions and Suits at Law or in Equity, which may be inſtituted in that Kingdom, decided in his Maſteſty’s Courts therein finally, and without Appeal from thence: Therefore, for removing all Doubts reſpecting the ſame, May it pleaſe your Maſteſty that it may be declared and enacted; and be it declared and enacted by the King’s moſt
